Repsol has more than 700 accessible and sustainable service stations in Spain, Portugal, and Peru. It was also the first company in the world to obtain a *BREEAM* certificate, the leading international method for sustainable building certification, for one of its service stations. Repsol is also a leading employer of people with disabilities, who already number more than 700 on the company's workforce.

Repsol's Executive Director of Marketing, Antonio Calçada, who accepted the award, said "it's especially exciting to receive this recognition for our accessible and sustainable service stations project, as it represents the corporate values we believe in. Additionally, tells us we're doing things properly and motivates us even more to continue working and innovating to offer services and create opportunities for society."

The company has received several recognitions for its initiatives in integrating the disabled and in sustainability. Repsol is one of the sector leaders in the Dow Jones Sustainability Index, which chooses the companies with the best performance in sustainability each year. Repsol's sustainability score almost doubles the industry average. Furthermore, the company is a constant presence in the FTSE4Good, Ethibel, Euronext and CDLI indices, among others.
